- 2. Draw a family genogram (explained in the book) and describe the issues that emerge from your study of your family that you identify as challenges and strengths that arise from your reflection.
- 3. Summarize your assessment of your ability to be a differentiated leader and the challenges you still experience.
- 4. Have a one-hour discussion with a member of your mentor team to process what you are discovering about yourself and how it affects your work in ministry.

Friedman, *A Failure of Nerve: Leadership in the Age of the Quick Fix*, revised edition (Church Publishing, 2017). Based on the concepts presented in Friedman's book do an analysis of yourself and your ministry context and write a 4-6 page paper outlining what you discovered about yourself as a leader and the system in which you work. Describe what you might change in your leadership philosophy and practice to be a more effective leader. Share the paper with your ministry mentor.

After reading the book take the included "Emotional Intelligence Appraisal." Have an extended conversation with both your ministry mentor and personal mentor over your Appraisal results and how you view your own emotional-relational intelligence.

Construct a chart or outline of what you see are the strengths and weaknesses in each of the four models you explored. Then write a 6-8 page paper on your philosophy of leadership in which you integrate much of what you have already learned in class and in target assignments 1A to 1D. Incorporate what you learned from your study in your philosophy but create a document that expresses your leadership values and commitments, the style you have leaned on in the past and what is

emerging for you in your approach to leading in your ministry context. Share this paper with your ministry mentor.

Assignment: Prior to the DM 802 Bible and Theology Seminar reflect on the passages about ordination (from the OT and NT), Paul's first letter to Timothy, and the textbooks by biblical scholars in the course syllabus and discuss them with seminar participants.

Suggested Assignment: At the conclusion of the DM 802 Bible and Theology Seminar sketch your theology of: 1) worship; 2) preaching; 3) the sacraments/ordinances; 4) discipleship/spiritual formation; 5) evangelism; and 6) pastoral care in about 2-3 paragraphs per topic (6-9 pages). Then read Wallace M. Alston and Cynthia Al Jarvis, *The Power to Comprehend With All the Saints: The Formation and Practice of a Pastor-Theologian* (Eerdmans, 2009), pp. 131-46, 237-294, and 337-368; and Zac Hicks, *The Worship Pastor: A Call to Ministry for Worship Leaders and Teams* (Zondervan, 2016). In a 6-page reflection, share how your understandings were challenged (or confirmed), expanded, etc. Share paper, and have a 45 minute conversation with, your Faculty Mentor.

Select a cultural text (examples in part 2 of the Vanhoozer book) or trend (examples in part 3 of the Vanhoozer book) from your ministry context and prepare a theological analysis paper of 14-15 pages. The text/trend could be from the culture in which your ministry context is located, from the culture of your

ministry context, or it could be present in both. Share paper with your faculty and ministry mentors.

Where do you see triangles, reactivity, and anxiety in the system, etc. and how can you as a leader address the challenges these dynamics pose for the organization? Identify the healthy ways your system functions and discuss how you can encourage healthier functioning. Share your paper with your mentor team and discuss with them your learning.

Foundations Seminar for possible revision. Once you have received preliminary approval from the Foundations Seminar professors you are then free to submit your Project Proposal to your mentor team for possible revision and final approval.

Write a Reading Reflection Report and an additional 4-page personal reflection of how you assess your own journey toward living an undivided life. Discuss your insights with your personal mentor.

This may involve starting some new groups to build community, or incorporate some of the ideas within your existing groups or ministry organization. Write an outline of the plan and present it to your ministry mentor. If possible implement at least two parts of the plan within six months after reading the book.

Each of these listed movies explores the concept of community and demonstrates how leaders develop within the life of the community. Take notes on what you notice about the community depicted in the movie including, how it formed, the challenges it faced, where it failed, how it found renewal, who emerged as the leader, rituals the group engaged that helped bond them together. Then write a brief 2-3 page reflection paper on what you learned about your own community of faith and what lessons you might apply to your ministry context and any insights you discovered about leadership. Look for how God was at work within the community depicted in the movie. How is God at work in forming the community to which you belong? Share your paper and insights with your mentor team.

Then write a brief 5-6 page reflection paper on the insights you gained from reading about the person's life--including the person's struggles, failures, resilience, redemption, and commitment to their call (vocation). Express what it teaches you about your own sense of call and how you are living out your own vocation. Include a section in the paper that describes the legacy you want to leave for future generations. Share your paper and insights with your mentor team.

Write out 8 key insights you gathered from the book and your triad conversations about mentoring and leadership and share with your personal mentor.
